



**ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMINATIONS (College Entrance Examination Board)**

This information sheet is intended to help students admitted to the University of Toronto Mississauga understand how we recognize Advanced Placement Examinations. The information on this sheet only applies to admitted students who are registered during the **2011-2012** academic year.

A list of possible transfer credits is given below. You can expect to receive credit for your Advanced Placement examinations provided that you achieve a grade of 4 or 5, and successfully complete your studies. No more than three full credits will be accredited towards your degree here. If you wish to decline or forfeit any of these credits, you must meet with an academic advisor in the Office of the Registrar at U of T Mississauga **no later than September 30, 2011**. The option to forfeit is only available to students who have not attended another post secondary institution. Please note that if you forfeit credit for an Advanced Placement course, and you were given two half credit equivalent courses here, you will forfeit both half credits.

Any courses listed below as “Exclusions” are courses offered here in which you may *not* enrol unless you choose to forfeit the transfer credit. In addition, you may not enrol in any courses which are listed in the U of T Mississauga Calendar as exclusions for these courses or the transfer credit courses.

Final AP results must be sent electronically from the Educational Testing Services (ETS) to Admissions and Awards. You can make the arrangement at: [www.collegeboard.com/student/testing/ap/exgrd\\_rep.html](http://www.collegeboard.com/student/testing/ap/exgrd_rep.html). The U of T code is 0982. Please note that final results issued from your school are not acceptable.

**Legend:** The first three letters of the course code indicate the discipline, or subject area. The first number of the code indicates the year level of the course where 1 = first year and 2 = second year. The next two numbers indicate the specific course and “\*\*\*” indicates that there is no exact equivalent at U of T for the course you have taken, so a generic credit is granted. Thus POL1\*\*Y represents a generic credit in Political Science at the first year level.
